- are a signatory to the UN Global Compact and commit to ensuring that these principles are reflected in our business strategy, day-to-day operations, organisational culture, sphere of influence and relationship with suppliers;
- maintain a code of ethics (GMS01-02 Code of Ethics) that helps us to ensure we do things safely, ethically and responsibly;
- mandate that our suppliers commit to fair employment policies, including humane treatment of their employees and no use of child labour;
- maintain a whistleblowing facility (GMS03-11-01 Speaking Out) that enables all employees and contractors to raise concerns without fear of reprisals;
- mandate that our employees and contractors comply with this policy, and
- ensure our Group Ethics and Compliance Committee meets regularly to monitor, and take action to maintain, the effectiveness of this policy.
